STUDENTS CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

The students are supposed to behave in a manner worthy to their respective profession, as well as to the ideals of the institution.

1. All the boys are strictly supposed to come to college clean shaved. Keeping beards is not accepted, and the same will be seriously dealt with.
2. The students should not use powered vehicles of any kind inside the campus, and should park their vehicles in the appropriate area provided

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All the students are expected to be in their class rooms before 8.50 am
2. The students are expected to keep the college premises very clean.
3. The students are expected to maintain good discipline in the college campus.
4. The students are expected to wear full uniform on all working days, except Friday.
5. The students should have their respective Id-Cards on them in the college premises.
6. The students have to write the weekly, internal and model tests properly. Those who fail in their respective courses have to attend the coaching classes.
7. Regarding the leave aspects, the students have to get prior permission from the concerned authority. Taking leave without prior permission will be viewed seriously.
8. Regarding any grievance on academic or non academic matters, the students are asked to approach the HOS through their Class-in -Charges.
9. The students should respect the faculty in all aspects . When a faculty member enters the class , the students are supposed to stand up and remain standing unless and until they are addressed to be seated by the faculty.
10. The students are expected to maintain 100% attendances in all classes. Those who maintain 100% will be rewarded by the management.
11. Students are not expected to collect money for a what-so-ever reason in the campus, without the prior approval of the Principal.
12. If any student involved in ragging or teasing, immediately he/ she will be dismissed from the college.
13. Day scholar students should not enter the hostel without the prior permission from the authorities.
14. Consumption of alcohol, tobacco and the habit of smoking will be viewed seriously.
15. The students must stay either with the parents or in the college hostel. Staying outside the college without parents is not entertained.
16. In case of any damage or loss of the college properties, the respective student/students would be held financially responsible.

17. During the lunch interval, the girl students must be in the waiting Hall of the respective blocks.
18. Cell Phones are strictly prohibited inside the campus.
19. Students have to converse in English in the College premises.
20. Students can express their views in all matters to their Class Committee representatives or Class-in-Charges.
21. Regarding any grievances the students are advised to contact the Class-in-Charge.

Indulgence in any of the following activities is considered as an offence and is subjected to punishment:

1. Behaving immorally inside the campus.
2. Disturbing or disrupting the work of fellow students or staff
3. Causing damage to the college properties or of any student or staff.
4. Unlawful entry into the lecture halls without permission
5. Unauthorized use of the property of the college
6. Smoking in the College campus
7. Tampering with or misuse of safety equipment
8. Participation in unauthorized activities in the college campus.
9. Failing to obey the instructions given by a faculty.
10. Activities involving physical violence or personal indignity
11. RAGGING of any kind
12. Eve-teasing of any kind
13. Use of the college name in any publication or notice without the prior approval of the Principal.

HOSTEL RULES

1. Keep hostel rooms and premises neat and clean.
2. Hostellers should speak only in English.
3. The hostel rooms are subject to inspection by the hostel authorities to make sure that they are kept neat and tidy and no unauthorized items like liquor, drugs, lethal weapons etc. are kept in the room.
4. The hostellers themselves are personally responsible to safeguard their valuable belongings and always keep the cupboards locked.
5. Movement Register is kept with the security guard at the entrance of the hostel and should be signed properly.
6. Perfect silence is to be observed during study time and sleep time. Students are not allowed to enter others room during study time.
7. No hostellers are allowed to remain in the hostel during regular class hours without the written permission of the warden.
8. Visitors are allowed only on Sundays and holidays between 10 am to 6 pm. Only those persons mentioned by the parents in the application form of the hostel would be permitted to visit and such visits will be restricted to the lobby.
9. Students are allowed to go out only on Sundays from 10 am to 6 pm. They should inform the deputy warden about their departure and arrival and the same should be entered in the movement register.
10. Hostellers may go home only once in a month and the days are given by the college authorities in advance and the same may be intimated to the parents. If anybody wants to go home other than this has to get permission from Director and deputy warden.
11. The attendance of the student on the departure day before the leave or holidays and the arrival day after the leave or holidays will be considered seriously and if any person found has to bring his parents to enter into the hostel.

12. Hostellers should not damage any hostel property and if done will be dealt seriously and they should abide the decisions made by the hostel administration.
13. All cases of illness must be immediately reported to the warden.
14. Hostellers are not allowed to keep any power driven vehicles in the hostel and in the college premises.
15. The hostellers are not allowed to use any extra electrical or electronic devices inside the room.
16. The management reserves all rights to terminate the lodging of any inmate at any time without prior notice.
17. Hostellers are not allowed to stay overnights outside.
18. Day scholars are not allowed to enter into the hostel without the permission of the warden.
19. Switch off the lights and fans in the hostel premise when not in use. Keep the doors and windows closed while leaving the rooms.
20. Surprise visits will be made by the hostel authorities.

LIBRARY

1. Users (Students / staff) should sign in and out with their ID card at the counter when they enter or exit the library.
2. All the belongings of the users should be kept in the shelves provided outside. They are not permitted to bring anything inside the library except loose sheets for taking down notes.
3. Silence and Strict discipline should be maintained inside the library.
4. Chairs and tables should not be shifted from their Positions.
5. Destroying or disfiguring the pages of the library books/documents with ink or pencil marks are strictly prohibited.
6. The borrower is held responsible for any damage done to the books he /she borrows. At the time of the issue, the users should check and satisfy that the books issued to him/ her are in good condition.
7. Periodicals and reference books cannot be borrowed.
8. All articles that are taken out of the library will be checked.
9. A fine of ten rupees will be levied from a student, for a book, for a day, if he / she fails to return the books by the due date.
10. Books will be lend on College ID card only.
11. Loss of books borrowed from the library is to be reported in writing, to the Librarian at the earliest. The students/ Staff concerned should replace the book or pay double the cost of the book, for an Indian Edition or Triple the cost of the book for a Foreign Edition.
12. Students are directed to return the books before the commencement of the University Examination and obtain "No Due Certificate" from the Librarian.
13. Students can use the internet facility for education Purpose only. Mobile Phones, Pen drive, CD-ROMs, Floppy disks etc. are not allowed inside the library. Timing of Circulation (Issue / Return/ Renewal) of books will be from 9.00 AM to 7.00 PM.

ACADEMIC PLANNING COUNCIL

The key reason behind the shining performance of Mar Ephraem in academics is due to the presence of a very good Academic planning council. With the help of representatives from all Schools, the Principal of our college leads the academic planning council . The academic planning council takes up the several considerations put forth by the various schools. After tedious brain storming sessions, the academic planning council formulates the various activities that have to be carried out throughout the semester. And the academic planning council approves the action plan and the same is implemented for the entire semester.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL(IQAC)

To maintain the quality of academic and Administrative performance the Internal quality assurance cell is functioning since 2009.

MENTORING SYSTEM

1. About 20 students are assigned to a teaching staff who is called as their mentor.
2. The mentor plays the role of the local guardian for those students assigned to him/her and motivates them in order to excel in every aspect.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

The committee consists of Head of various schools, the Director and a faculty representative from every School. They are nominated at the beginning of each semester. This Committee looks after the matters pertaining to the general discipline, for the smooth functioning of the college. This committee will meet to probe into the matter and recommend suitable actions to avoid recurrence of the violations.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

National service scheme:

The National Services Scheme was introduced in our college from 2014 initiated by the National Services Scheme of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Department of Youth affairs and Sports, Govt. of India. The NSS unit in the college benefits the students by encouraging them to participate in Services for the society such as Blood donation, Cleaning of surroundings, Creating awareness among the general public.

Youth Red Cross:

A Student wing of the international Red Cross Society has also been established in our college. The Youth Red Cross movement of our college encourages and trains students for services such as Providing First Aid for those in need, helping the sick and suffering etc. It also helps the mental morale development of the youth. It also promotes unity among the youth and helps to mould good human beings in them.

National Sports Organization:

The National Sports Organization is a nationwide movement to instill physical awareness amongst the youth. The NSO is responsible for organizing the sports day in the college. It also conducts regular meetings in which the students are encouraged to take up various sports activities. The NSO maintains the Sports Center, which comprises of a gymnasium, an indoor badminton court, table tennis court, Volley ball Court, basket ball court, Football court and Kabadi court. It also has Carom boards. The sports center houses the office of the Department of Physical Education.

Note: All students should enroll in any one of the personality and Character Development Programme (NSS/NSO/YRC).

Industrial Training / Internship:

The students may undergo Industrial training for a period as specified in the Curriculum during summer / winter vacation. In this case the training has to be undergone continuously for the entire period.

The students may undergo Internship at Research organization / University (after due approval from the Department Consultative Committee) for the period prescribed in the curriculum during summer / winter vacation, in lieu of Industrial training.

ANTI RAGGING CELL

As per the directions from the Govt. of India and Anna University, an Anti-ragging cell was introduced in our college. The cell is an efficient team consisting of faculty members, parents, and some local govt. officials. So far the cell has been proved effective in eliminating ragging incidents from our college.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT CELL

Aiming for the complete growth of women, Mar Ephraem started women cell since the start of the college. The cell focuses especially on women students for creating an awareness among them, maintaining their health, and the growth of good relationship. The cell thus acts as a supportive cell for the students throughout the course.

FACILITIES

LIBRARY

Mar Ephraem Library is housed in a two storied building covering an area of 900 Sq.M. It has a separate reference section, reading room, periodical section, back volume section, stack area and e-library. There is an information desk (Circulation counter) on the ground floor.

The Library is functioning under the open access system and having a total collection of 10300 Volumes with 3290 titles. Circulation (i.e. issue, renewal and return of books) takes place through Barcode System. All details of the Library collections are fed into the Computer software and Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is provided to our users. 90 print periodicals including 45 international journals are being subscribed in our Library.

E- Library with 510 CD ROM Database, NPTEL video lectures and web courses in various disciplines, Question bank facility, can be accessed throughout the campus via our intranet. The Library is enabled with Wi-Fi technology and security systems with Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV), monitors the movements of the users on both the floors. Mar Ephraem Library is an Institutional Member in DELNET.

CHAPEL:

Our college chapel is ecumenical which offers an attractive and tranquil space. All members of the college community and their guests are welcome to use it. Those who worship here make connections between their faith and their studies. Chapel services and discussion groups offer an opportunity to address questions of ultimate significance in a context that is thoughtful, honest and respectful and where spirituality may be explored in a meaningful way.

JESUS YOUTH:

The strength of the movement is its special focus on a Christ centered life on the Lord Jesus Christ: beginning with an experience of God nourished by prayer, the Word of God, the sacraments and fellowship, and sharing the good News of Jesus Christ with others. Though not an actual community, Jesus Youth is a network of small but vibrant groups of young people. In their own life situations, they strive to give time to the Lord, responding to the challenges of today's world, in the power of the Holy Spirit. This is the strength of Jesus Youth Ministry in Mar Ephraem. Every Friday, the students forgo one meal a day and spend the time in the Chapel praying for the youth of the world.

HOSTEL:

To accommodate and fulfill the needs of students from distant places Mar Ephraem has very good hostel facilities. Mar Ephraem provides separate hostels for boys and girls .

TRANSPORT:

A full fledged Transport Department functions in the college with buses to provide transport facility to students and staff from various places of Kanyakumari and Thiruvananthapuram district. This service is offered ensuring a hassle-free and safe transportation. New bus routes are introduced immediately on receipt of request to the transport coordinator.

CANTEEN:

The college has a canteen to cater to the needs of students, staff and visitors. It provides Tea ,coffee, soft drinks ,snacks ,Tiffin and other stationary products.

REPOGRAPHIC CENTER:

Our college has established “Mar Ephraem DTP center ” for providing the printout ,DTP, Xerox for the students at low cost .This reduces the additional study expenses for various study materials. It is accessible for both students and staff on all working days from 9 am to 4pm.

WIFI FACILITY

The college has a well established computer network system. The campus is fully equipped with high speed WiFi facility all over the campus capable of delivering 10 Mbps through NKN.

RESEARCH CENTER

Mar Ephraem Research center is committed to research in the field of image processing, Bio-medical applications and data handling.

Our college is currently doing many research work with DST, ISRO, Rajiv Gandhi center for bio technology.MOU 's are been signed with government and private agencies for long term relationship aimed at promoting and facilitating collaborative reach. Various faculty members had completed their research work while some others are doing their works in various engineering fields.

HEALTH CENTER

Our college is equipped with a health center which takes care of the health problems faced by the students and provides primary care for those who need immediate medical care. It is provided with a number of medicines and a health care wagon , which is an assistance to the cell.
